7th Annual Firefighter Bike Pilgrimage:

A Journey of Remembrance and Unity

HAMILTON, ON– The torch of remembrance and unity will light up as 74 firefighters, coming from Beckwith, Kingston, Hamilton, Markham, Montreal, Oakville, Oshawa, Ottawa, Stephenville NFLD, Toronto, Vaughn, and Whitby and gear up for a three-day, 575-kilometre bike ride. Led by the Toronto Professional Firefighter Celtic Society, they will be cycling from Hamilton to Ottawa's National Firefighters Memorial from September 6-8, 2023, come wind, rain, or shine.

This pilgrimage, now in its 7th year, aims to raise funds and awareness for the Canadian Fallen Firefighters Foundation (CFFF). As the country grapples with unprecedented wildfires, this ride amplifies the immense value and sacrifice of our firefighters, the majority of whom voluntarily serve their communities.

Among those to be remembered are Ottawa firefighter Ryan Hill, who tragically lost his life at 37 due to brain cancer linked to his service, Toronto Fire Captain Norman Sinclair, Toronto District Chief Chris Cochon, and Toronto Fire Caption Brad Andrews, among several others. Their names and the memories of 85 other heroes will be etched onto the Memorial Wall this year, joining over 2000 names of the brave dating back to the late 1800s.

The culmination of this journey is the National Firefighters Memorial in Ottawa on September 10, 2023. This sombre event of gratitude, honour and remembrance draws hundreds of firefighters across Canada and its territories, reflecting the strong bond that unites all in Canada's fire service.

Having already raised \$300,000 to date, the goal for this year's ride is an ambitious \$100,000 for the CFFF.

David Cossitt, President of the Toronto Fire Celtic Society, said, "We greatly appreciate people cheering us along the route. Encouragement truly boosts our spirits. Donations can be made at <u>www.celticfireride.ca</u>, where supporters can pick a rider to contribute towards."
